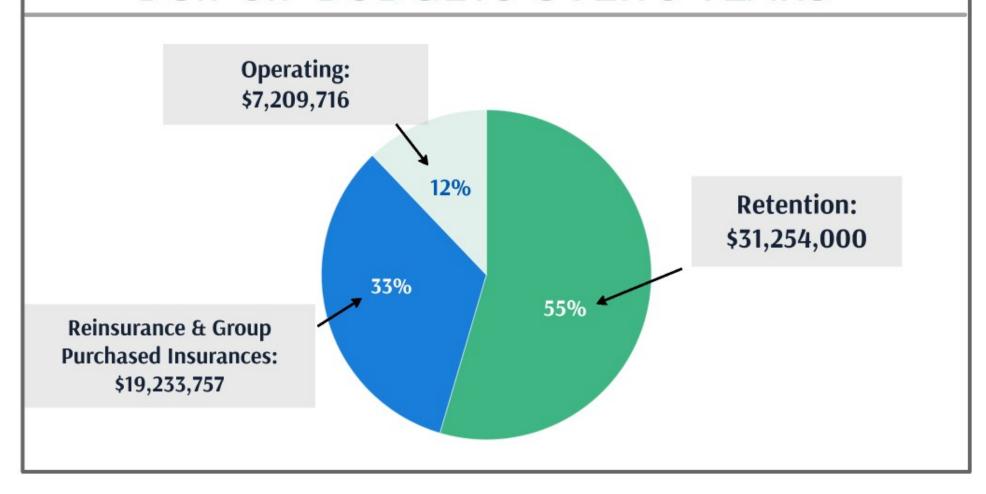

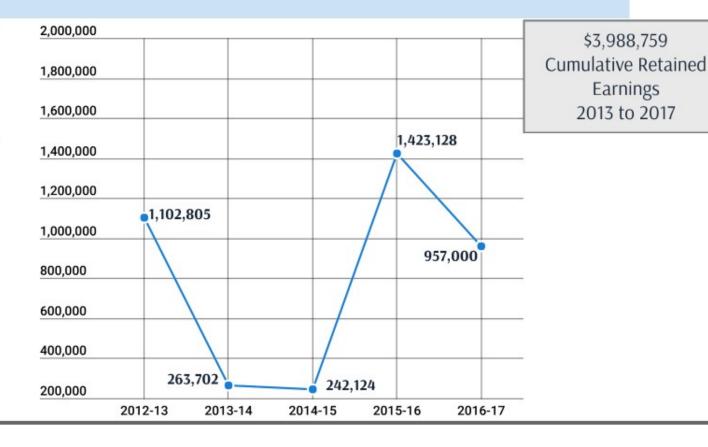


BCIP JIF Retention Fund Most Recent Five Years

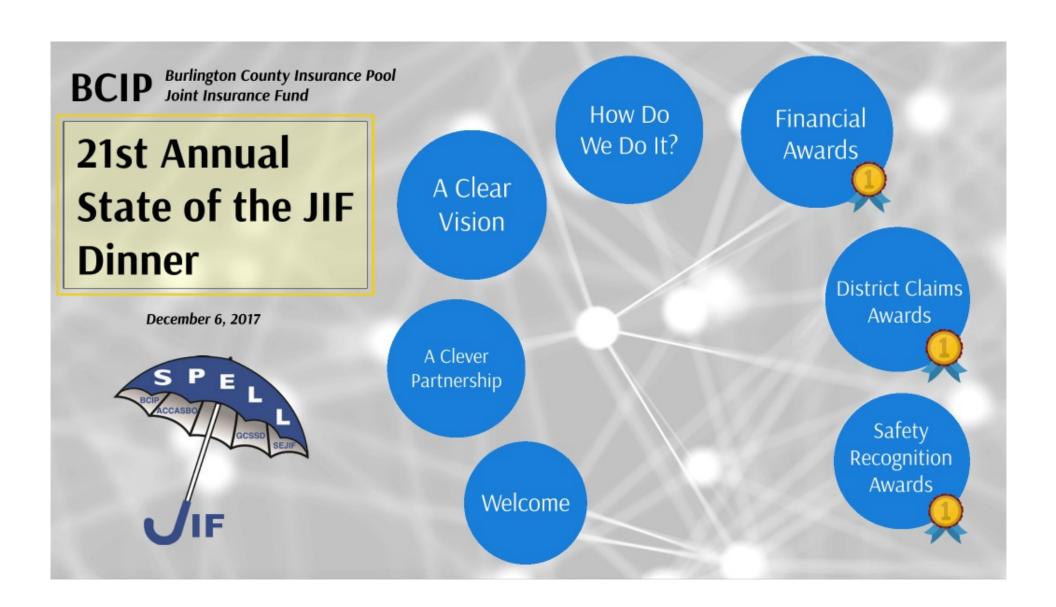

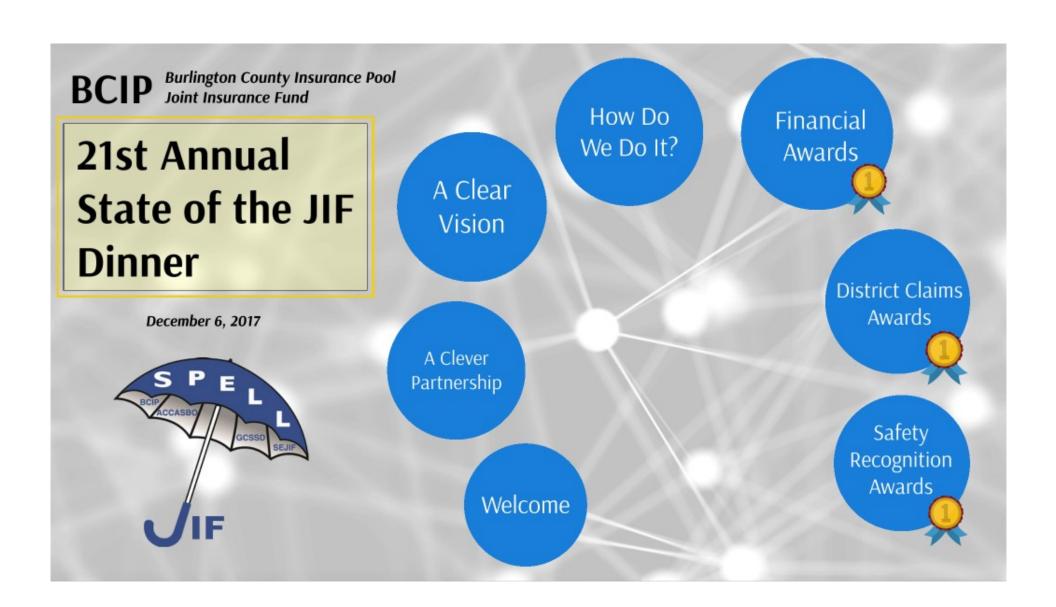


Thank You and Congratulations

Financial Performance Awards are Dependent on

- How we react to claims when they happen, AND
- · What we do everyday to reduce the chances that claims occur

When we do have claims, they begin within member districts with one person who is referred to as the **District Claim Coordinator.**





Prompt Reporting is Key

Using the 0-3 day period as the baseline, the cost of a late reported claim is:

9% more if reported between 4-7 days 20% more if reported between 1-2 weeks 32% more if reported between 3-8 weeks 72% more if reported at one month or later

\$21,862,378
Paid out in Workers Comp
Claims in last 5 Years

If we had reported late by:

4-7 days **+** \$1,967,614

1-2 weeks + \$4,372,476

3-8 weeks + \$6,995,961

1 mo. or later + \$15,740,912

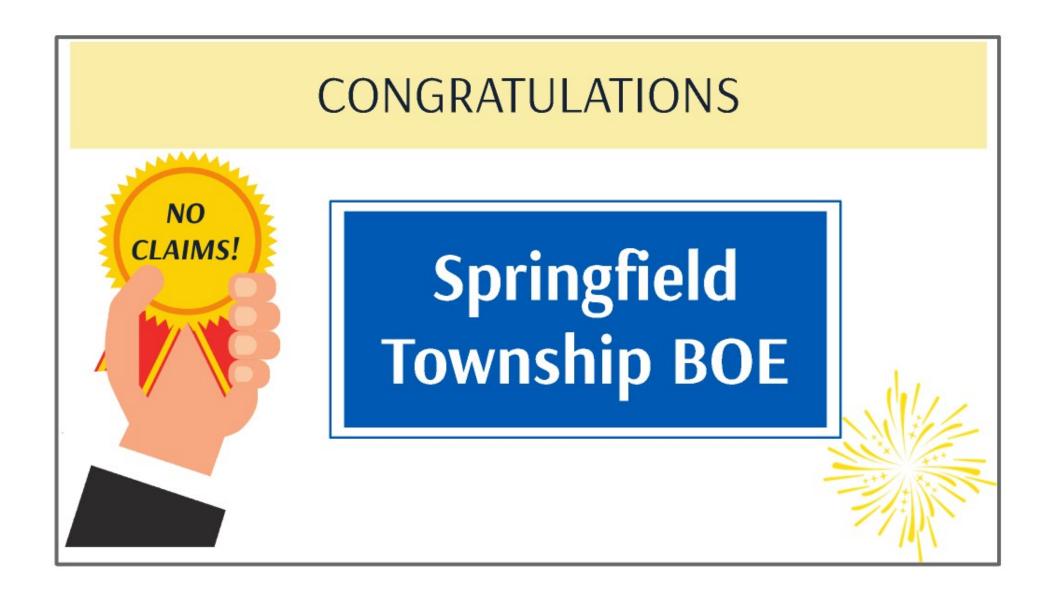

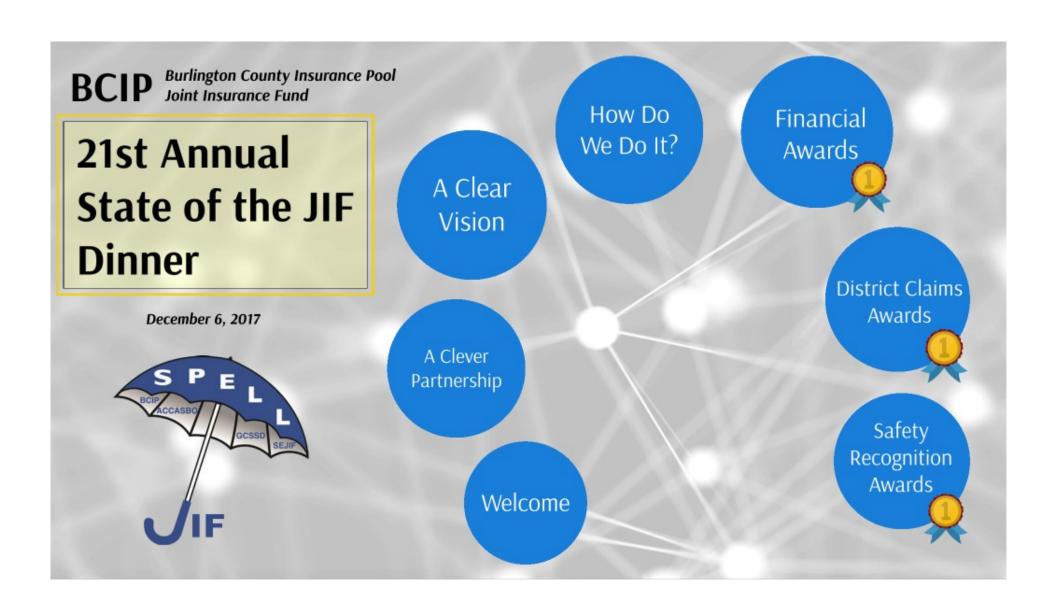

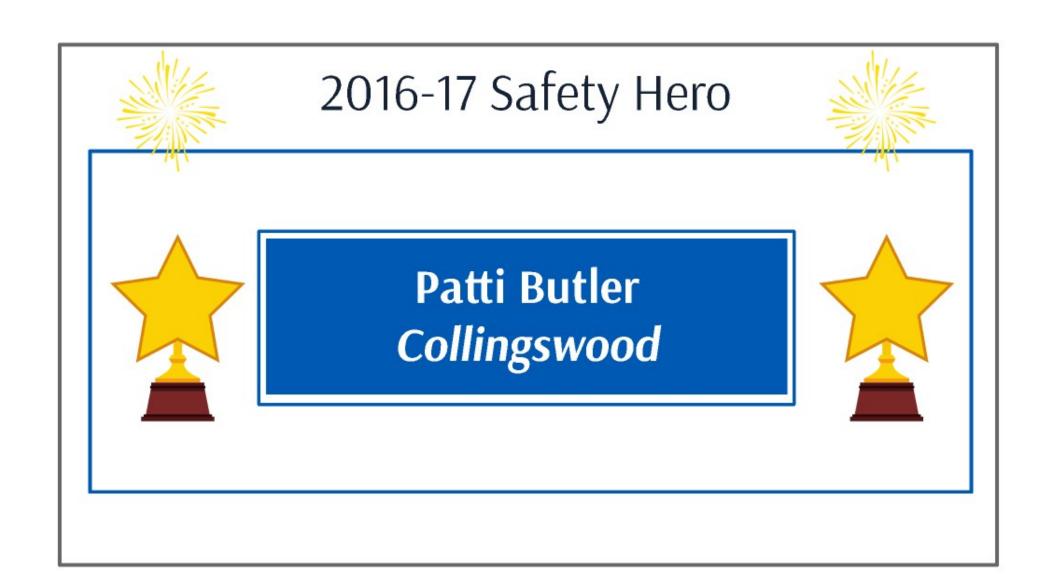
